The popular Westlaw Profiler provides instant access to critical background information on attorneys, judges, and expert witnesses such as cases, jury verdicts, dockets, depositions, and authored material.

Millions of links give you the instant background information you need to make a stronger case. The expert witness; the judge; the opposing counsel; you may know them by reputation, but Westlaw Profiler lets you find out how they earned it. Learn how many cases they've handled like yours and how the cases came out. Find out what they've written. Learn how they think and how they're likely to act. Westlaw Profiler provides a new source for legal practitioners to locate competitive intelligence and find competent co-counsel.

Westlaw Profiler is available at all workstations in the Library's media center. After logging onto Westlaw, just click on the Directory tab and the Profiler link and then follow the prompts to enter your search. As always, assistance is readily available.

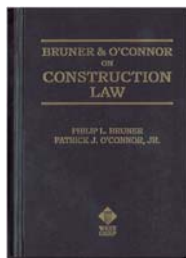
