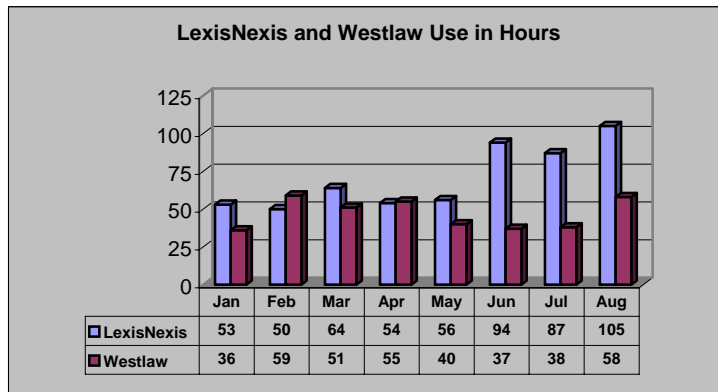

WHAT'S ONLINE AND WHAT'S ON THE SHELF?

In applying the organizational behavior precepts of *appreciative inquiry*, libraries are engaging in strength-based change by keeping the best of the past and combining with it the best of the present. Maintaining traditional texts while increasing access to online sources is the prevailing mandate for information repositories.

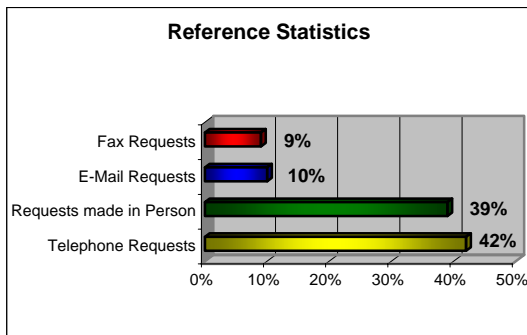
At the Law Library, research requests are regularly satisfied with information found both in print and electronic formats. Easiest to retrieve and disseminate electronically are court opinions and statutes. When searching for value-added materials such as treatises, commentaries, and journal articles users are becoming more particular about the credibility of sources. For this material, print formats are preferred over electronic.

The discerning patron is well aware that Google, or any other broad search engine has no scholarly standards. On the



other hand, **LexisNexis, Westlaw**, and other blue ribbon, premium-priced online databases are as traditional and credible as the print formats they replace. What they lack in superceded and archived material is made up for on the Library's bookshelves.

The duality of today's library services is an exciting yet challenging task. The expectation that online access would reduce the overall cost of information sources has not materialized and, equally frustrating, the rising cost of print subscriptions has resulted in the elimination of long-standing titles by both the publishers and their customers. For our patrons, the uncertainty in information access is relieved by the services of a knowledgeable staff that is qualified to assess needs and identify the proper resources.
