It was recently announced that the Defiance County Law Library in Defiance, Ohio will be "decommissioned" before the end of 2007 because most of its resources are available online. As the financial support from county governments continues to diminish under legislative mandate, it is anticipated that other county law libraries will close. As long as possible, the Dayton Law Library will reach out to the attorneys in the affected counties and offer membership and services that can be supplied remotely.
